#### Join the Chorus!





Dr. Davids is a proud founding member of the Canadian Chamber Choir, Canada's national choral ensemble providing a professional-level choral environment for Canadian singers, conductors, and composers. Artistic Director of the CCC since 2004, Dr. Davids has led the ensemble on concert and workshop tours of Ontario, Manitoba, Nova Scotia, and Saskatchewan. She is currently Director of Music Ministries at Trinity United Methodist Church, Wilmette. A native of London, ON, she now resides in Skokie with her husband, baroque violinist Martin Davids, and their two children.

The concert will conclude with the last two movements of Randall Thompson's powerful Peaceable Kingdom for a cappella chorus.


